- ▶ There are 5 areas you should consider:
 - ▶ English 12
 - ▶ Math/Science
 - ▶ 2nd language
 - ▶ # of approved academic courses
 - ▶ Minimum average



Admission Requirements

1. GENERAL Entrance Requirements

- English 11 & 12 + Literacy Assessment
- 3 Academic Courses
- Foundations Math 11 or Pre-Calculus 11 (recommended)
- A second language to at least Grade 11*
