## Youth Work in Trades

- Provides graduation credits for completing paid apprenticeship work in Skilled Trades BC trades under the supervision of a certified trades person
- Students will receive 16 credits on their high school transcripts
- 4 credits for every 120 hours of work
- $\$ 1,000$ scholarship possible if you continue in trade area for at least six months after graduation
