- Minimum average


## 1. GENERAL Entrance Requirements

- English 12 + Literacy 12 Assessment
- 3 Academic Courses
- Foundations Math 11 or Pre-Calculus 11 (recommended)
$\square$ A second language to at least Grade 11*

2. SPECIFIC Program Course Requirements

- Check the required course for your program or faculty
- This will vary from one university to another
